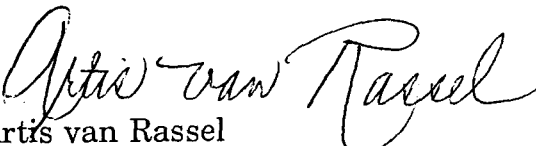

CALL TO ORDER

Vice-Chairman Dale Walters called the meeting to order at
7:32 p.m.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Bob Weitman moved to adopt the agenda. Second - Craig
Wakefield. Motion passed unanimously 4/0.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Bob Weitman moved to approve the August 7, 1995 regular
meeting minutes and the August 16, 1995 special joint
meeting minutes. Second - Craig Wakefield. Motion passed
unanimously 4/0.

GUEST

President Hallberg introduced Paula Ascher, Director of
Professional/Technical Education. The New Visions program
is part of professional/technical education.

Ms. Ascher advised the Board that the college now offers
four associate degree programs in business and two
certificate programs. Fall Term the college will be offering
three vocational classes: EMT, Drafting, and Early
Childhood Education.

The college has just completed the Quality Assurance Project
which reviews all professional/technical programs for quality
and equal opportunity.

Director Ascher explained that because of our county's small
population it is difficult to establish vocational programs.
The college must identify areas with wide appeal in order to
assure a large enough number of students. The college then
must meet the needs of a core group of students.
Development is spurred by input from the community. The
Business Forum in conjunction with Ed Armstrong will help
determine what training is needed; how many employees and
when they are needed; and if employers' needs can be met
through cooperative education.

Engineering is a good example; it can apply to a wide range of people. If the college picks a few classes in mechanical and/or civil engineering we can see if interest exists in the community. The college could select a few classes for the next several terms: surveying, as an example. The roadblocks to offering these classes are math and equipment. Craig Wakefield suggested well-publicized workshops introducing the basic requirements for engineering.

Helen Bonsall, Dean of Instruction, noted that the Business Forum will provide an avenue to advise the community of our needs. She stated that our CAD software will be upgraded in order to incorporate it into classes that will make it pay off. Eva Noble asked if it was possible to get grants for equipment. Paula Ascher responded that it may be possible. President Hallberg noted that the college may be able to get older but useable equipment from other community colleges. The college could possibly contact the several large surveying companies in the county. Craig Wakefield suggested Terry Malone, Engineer, as a possible instructor for workshops for contractors regarding mitigation of earthquake damage.

President Hallberg advised the Board that Paula was also responsible for the new welding and criminal justice classes. The college may be able to pick up training opportunities associated with the new jail and correctional facility.

BUDGET REPORT

Mark Sybouts advised the Board that for the 1994-95 budget year, the college has already received approximately \$41,000 in timber revenue and the fourth quarter check was \$63,000. The college had conservatively budgeted for \$50,000, therefore, the college is approximately \$54,000 over the budget amount in that line item. Eva Noble noted that this was not due to the amount of timber cut, but the price at which timber was being sold. Mark advised that the state will begin commercial thinning. Eva Noble noted that Mark Labhart, District Forester, anticipated that this will produce a need for loggers greater than the number of loggers available.

RESOLUTION

President Hallberg advised the Board that the grant monies represented in Resolution 3, Tillamook County Commission on Children and Families Literacy Grant, was written by Anne Key, Acting Director of Developmental Education.

MOTION

Eva Noble moved to adopt Resolution 3, Tillamook County Commission on Children and Families Literacy Grant. Second - Bob Weitman. Motion passed unanimously 4/0. (A copy of this resolution is attached to these minutes.)

PERSONNEL REPORT

Artis van Rassel reviewed the Personnel Report with the Board. Steve Kerr, Math Instructor, began his appointment to full-time instructor today, September 11, 1995.

FACILITIES REPORT

Mark Sybouts advised the Board that renovation and construction at the Tillamook Campus is coming close to completion. The final inspection has not yet occurred; the electrician, a sub-contractor, is having a minor dispute with the County. The General Contractor said that he will pay disputed amount and deduct from the electrician if necessary.

There are a couple of minor problems to be resolved: linoleum puffing up in the bathrooms, and a few non-operational exterior lights.

Mark demonstrated the new lights in the multi-purpose room. The instructors' desks have arrived, along with classroom tables and podiums. The tablet armchairs are scheduled to arrive this week. The locksmith is in the process of re-keying locks to the current key schedule. Landscaping will be completed prior to Open House. The orange carpeting has been replaced. Discussion ensued. The board will tour the facility after the Board meeting is adjourned.

BOARD OF EDUCATION MEMBER SEARCH & APPOINTMENT PROCESS

President Hallberg advised the Board that as a result of an unsuccessful search for a new board member, Bill Dahlien and Wayne Jensen have spoken with Kathy Jensen. Kathy Jensen was a TBCC Board of Education member in 1985 prior to moving out of the area. Since Kathy has returned to Tillamook County and resides in the proper zone, she has agreed to serve the college once again. Craig Wakefield noted that two individuals he talked to spoke highly of Ms. Jensen. Eva Noble noted that she has good qualifications for the position. President Hallberg noted that the individual the Board appoints to the position must then be elected to the position.

MOTION

Eva Noble moved to appoint Kathrine Jensen to the Board of Education, Position 4. Second - Craig Wakefield. Motion passed unanimously 4/0.

The President RECOMMENDS adoption of the following resolution:

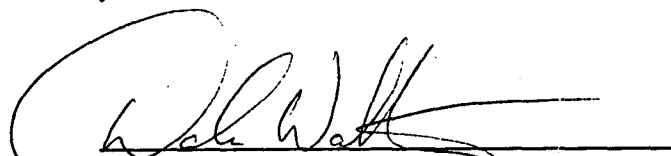

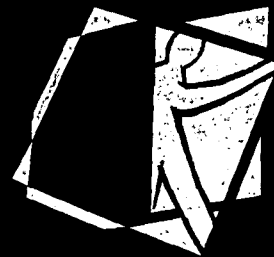
