To learn about eligibility and offerings at your high school, contact your high school counselor.



TBCC can help you connect with other community colleges in Oregon and with Tillamook Regional Medical Center to take advantage of educational opportunities in the health care field. High school students in Tillamook County can take classes through the Health Occupations Program through their high school to earn credit. Students will need to enroll at the community college offering the program they are interested in and at TBCC. TBCC offers program prerequisites, general education requirements, related coursework, and some program courses.

GENERAL STUDIES DEGREE

TBCC offers a number of options for students planning to transfer to other colleges and universities. You can start college at TBCC and transfer to a four-year college or university. You can save money by taking your general education and prerequisite courses here, pay our lower tuition rate, then transfer to any university you choose. Many courses may transfer and be applied toward a bachelor degree. Our career education advisors can help you plan your transfer.

Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer Degree (AAOT)

The Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer Degree is for students who are interested in earning a four-year degree at an Oregon public university. The AAOT allows you to complete some of your degree requirements at TBCC.

Course, class standing or GPA requirements for specific majors, departments or schools are not necessarily satisfied by an AAOT degree. For the best transfer experience, work with a career education advisor to select your courses. It is important to take courses at TBCC that align with your planned major and program of study and that fulfill the requirements of the Oregon public university where you want to attend.

Associate of Science Oregon Transfer-Business Degree

The ASOT-BUS degree is for students who are interested in transferring to a four-year degree program at an Oregon public university to pursue a bachelor's degree in business. If you graduate with the ASOT-BUS degree, you will have completed the first step toward your bachelor's degree program. You will transfer with most of your coursework accepted with credit toward your four-year degree. Visit with a TBCC career education advisor and talk to an advisor at the university where you plan to transfer since universities have specific requirements for admission to their business programs.

Associate of General Studies Degree

The Associate of General Studies Degree lets you customize a program that meets your needs. You can include courses from career technical programs such as agriculture and natural resources or business administration in your academic plan, as well as general studies and transfer courses. At completion of the degree, you will be able to go right into the workforce. If your goal is to transfer to a four-year university, you will need to get advice from the university where you plan to transfer and work with a career education advisor at TBCC.

Associate of Science Degree

The Associate of Science Degree is for students who are interested in transferring to an Oregon public university. Students pursuing this degree are generally interested in majors such as engineering, the sciences, computer science, or mathematics. For the best transfer experience, work with a career education advisor to select courses that will meet the requirements that align with your major at the university you want to attend.

Degree Partnership & Four-Year Transfer Programs

TBCC has a Degree Partnership Program (DPP) with Oregon State University (OSU). Students can complete one application process and be admitted to TBCC and OSU at the same time. Students will be assigned advisors at both schools, gain increased flexibility in scheduling with access to more courses, and enjoy opportunities to access services and participate in college life on both campuses. PAYING FOR COLLEGE



COLLEGE CAN BE EXPENSIVE!

Funds are available for not only tuition and books, but in some cases can be used for living expenses as well! Financial Aid is any type of funding that helps you pay the costs of your college education. There is funding available through federal, state, private or institutional sources.

In addition to federal financial aid, please be sure to consider these other funding sources:

The Oregon Student Assistance Commission (OSAC)

You don't need to be a merit scholar or a student with financial need to apply for OSAC scholarships. There are 500+ scholarship programs and you may qualify, but you won't know unless you apply.

The Oregon Promise Grant

Oregon Promise is a state grant program that covers most of the tuition at any Oregon community college. Oregon Promise is for recent Oregon high school graduates and GED recipients who enroll in an Oregon community college within six months of graduation.

TBCC First Class Scholars

This merit-based scholarship may be awarded to students attending TBCC who are recent Tillamook County high school graduates with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 if entering a CTE program or a 3.0 if enrolling in a transfer degree program.

1. Application

Our application process is online. Log-on to <http://tillamookbaycc.edu/admissions-registration/> and fill out an application so we can start your student record.

2. Placement

Credit-seeking students will need to be assessed in reading, writing, and math skills to **assure you are placed in an appropriate course level prior to registration.** Placement level in these areas may be demonstrated with a placement test, a previous college transcript or degree, state high school assessment (with approved high school courses), or SAT, ACT, or other college placement assessments. Need to take a placement test? TBCC staff administer placement testing through the TBCC Library. Contact the TBCC Librarian at (503) 842-8222 ext. 1720.

3. Orientation

All credit-seeking students need to attend an orientation before you can get to the fun of registering for your courses. The orientation dates and times are published in the TBCC Schedule of Classes each term. The schedule can be found at
