Advantages of this Partnership

The partnership between Tillamook Bay Community College and Tillamook High School continues to be strong and productive, with regular meetings between the principal and vice-principal of THS and the president and chief academic officer of TBCC. The relationship is further supported through monthly meetings of the Tillamook Educational Consortium (TEC), which includes the same key people, county school district superintendents and high school principals. Student Services' personnel from the college and the high school communicate regularly and collaborate on student advising, placement, and annual events to educate high school students and their parents about the transition to college studies.

The strong relationship between the college and the high school is evidenced in the success of the accelerated learning options program, which provides an opportunity for high school students to earn college credits while still in high school. Accelerated learning options consist of dual credit classes and expanded options classes. Dual credit courses are taught on the high school campus by high school faculty, in collaboration with college faculty in the discipline. Expanded options classes are college courses taught on the TBCC campus by college faculty. Both options carry college credit for successful students, and also help students and their parents by offering cost savings toward the price of a college education.

The dual credit partnership between TBCC and THS yields costs savings to high school students and their parents. Students can earn college credits while enrolled in high school without incurring tuition costs, and shorten the time spent in earning a four-year or two-year degree. If students or their parents had paid tuition for these college-level dual credit classes in the 2016-17 year, these tuition charges would have totaled \$152,475.

Expanded options classes are those offered on TBCC's campus and taught by TBCC faculty and which are open to all TBCC students. High school students may enroll in these classes, with the high schools paying a reduced rate of tuition for these students to participate. In 2016-2017, tuition charges for THS students enrolled in expanded options classes would have totaled \$16,340. With the 20% tuition discount TBCC provides to its high school partners for these courses, THS actually paid \$12,900.

Dual Credit Classes:

During the 2016-17 academic year Tillamook High School faculty offered 20 sections and 19 dual credit courses (one course was taught twice during the year). These sections accounted for 418 duplicated enrollments by high school students, who were successful in earning 1,470 college credits.



Expanded Options Classes:

Thirty Tillamook High School students enrolled in 19 courses at TBCC's campus last year, earning 174 college credits through this option.

Overall Enrollments in Accelerated Options (dual credit and expanded options combined):

A total of 205 Tillamook High School students enrolled in accelerated options classes (30 expanded options students and 200 dual credit students, with some students taking both).

A total of 1,644 college credits were earned by these students.

Number of students enrolled in TBCC post-HS-----CAO Hovey

Thirty-four THS 2017 graduates have transferred to TBCC and are enrolled in college studies this fall.

First Class Scholars-----CAO Hovey

There are currently nine Tillamook High School students who were awarded First Class Scholarships and are attending TBCC. The scholarships are provided by the college to area high school students who qualify. The program works in conjunction with the Oregon Promise grant and provides two full years' worth of tuition up to 19 credits per term.



Update on “Grow Your Own Teacher” Grant

Oregon Coast Community College, in partnership with TBCC, has submitted a grant proposal to Meyer Memorial Trust to fund a project that will develop local teachers for the school districts in Lincoln and Tillamook Counties over the next several years. Juniors in the local HS that are interested in becoming a public school teacher will be recruited into this program. It would involve:

- Students taking dual credit college classes in their junior and senior years,
- Attending their local community college after HS graduation to take education and general education courses for 1-2 years,
- Attend Western Oregon University (WOU) for their junior year in college, majoring in Education,
- Coming back to their local area on the coast for their senior year at WOU, taking online classes to finish up their BS degree and doing their internships in the local schools,
- Hopefully being hired by the local school districts as a teacher after receiving their BS degree from WOU.

We should hear about the grant very soon.
