The candidate will teach students basic skills encompassing Math, Science, Writing, and Reading Comprehension, preparing students to take and pass the GED. TBCC seeks a collegial, dynamic educator committed to creating an environment of active student learning. In particular, we seek an individual who will take a leadership role in not only helping students complete their GED, but inspiring them to continue their education and/or career goals. This candidate must be able to operate as a member of the team, have highly developed interpersonal skills, and have the ability to communicate with people at all levels. Term of Employment

The Aide/Instructor position will be term by term based on enrollment.

Major Areas of Responsibility

- 7. Grade papers and perform other administrative duties as needed.
- 8. Utilize curricula that reflect the diverse educational, cultural, and linguistic backgrounds of the students served.
- 9. Develop incentives to keep participants in class.
- 10. Work with GED Instructor and Dean of Academic Partnerships to ensure program goals are being met.
- 11. Tutor students on an individual basis.

- 13. Willing to outreach and enroll new students.
- 14. Observe and evaluate student's performance.
