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Course Description:

The purpose of academic advising is to inspire, empower, and educate our students for success through ongoing and intentional conversations. These conversations will help establish a pathway to the realization of educational, career, and life goals.

TBCC Email:

TBCC will use electronic communication methods to conduct official and legal college business. Students are responsible to check their TBCC email and the TBCC student portal (MyTBCC) for information from the college.

Attendance:

Students are required to meet with their advisor before registering each term. Advisors will make every effort to accommodate a student's schedule to ensure there is a full review of each student's Career Education Plan and current career and educational goals.

Program Learning Outcomes:

Your Career Education Advisor will:

- 1. Provide you with assistance in developing a Career Education Plan (CEP).
- 2. Provide you with an overview of TBCC Student Services.
- 3. Help you with specific career information and transfer plans for your career goals.
- 4. Provide you with assistance in scheduling and registering for courses.
- 5. Provide you with developing action plans if you are on academic or financial aid suspension.
- 6. Provide you with a professional, courteous, and understanding academic advising experience.



- 7. Monitor your academic progress.
- 8. Be available to meet you at your convenience, Monday through Friday from 8:00-5:00 and on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings until 7:00.

The Student should plan to:

- 1. Schedule regular appointments with your Career Education Advisor prior to registration each term.
- 2. Come prepared to ask questions and take notes of key points discussed.
- 3. Conduct yourself in a professional and courteous manner.
- 4. Bring your TBCC Student ID (or other photo ID), any necessary documents, and be on time to your scheduled appointment.
- 5. Notify Student Services staff at 503-842-8222 extension 1100 if you need to cancel your appointment, or contact your advisor directly at their extension or email.
- 6. Routinely check your TBCC email and the MyTBCC portal for email news and advising updates.
