The Nursing Instructor must be able to act as a member of the team, have highly developed interpersonal skills, and have the ability to communicate with people at all levels. Essential Job Functions:

Key Areas

- Support the development of an innovative, trauma informed, culturally-responsive nursing program that meets the needs of a diverse student body.
- Provide academic leadership in the implementation of a robust nursing education program; including skills lab, online courses, SIM lab and clinicals
- Support student's academic success through innovative teaching and support mechanisms.
- Effectively teach coursework in assigned discipline.
- Engage in assessment of programs, course, program, and institutional learning outcomes via Student Outcomes & Assessment database.
- Attend faculty professional development and orientations as required and requested.

Specific Duties

- Teach lecture and/or clinical lab coursework that may range from foundations of nursing through advanced nursing practice in acute settings.
 - a) Simulation Coordination to maintain compliance with OSBN OARs, be the designated nursing faculty member to serve as the simulation coordinator of the simulation team to ensure simulation and integrity (OAR 0050 4.c).
 - i. Maintain simulation credentials as required

- ii. Oversee development and delivery of the simulation program for Allied Health courses
- b) Skills Lab Coordination
 - i. Oversee development and delivery of the skills lab for nursing and nurse assistant courses
- Measure student progress, course progress, program progress and institution level progress and use data to improve all.
- Meet all scheduled class periods and make up any absences promptly. May be asked to fill in for adjunct faculty in emergency situations.
- Prepare and develop materials for assigned classes.
- Communicate objectives and expectations of each course through multiple modalities and check for student understanding (e.g. in person, syllabi, Canvas).
- Evaluate students according to course objective and professional standards and report student progress in a timely manner.
- Utilize Canvas gradebook and Drop Out Detective to ensure student success.
- Integrate current teaching methods and technological changes and developments into curriculum and classroom presentations.
- Utilize outcome-based learning principles.
- Maintain requirements for student records, attendance, grades, and/or other documentation.
- Ensure a safe, quality classroom or lab, including equipment, supplies, and inventory.
- Use institutional process (e.g. database) to collect and analyze information.
- Work with Librarian to familiarize students with the availability and use of reference materials and Internet research in discipline.
- Engage in active teaching and field best practices utilizing innovation and creativity.
- Establish, post, and maintain office hours and be accessible based on student need according to policy and procedure.
- Provide feedback and input, when asked, on institutional and academic policies and procedures.

- Must pass a pre-employment criminal history background investigation.
- Must be able to lift and carry 25 pounds.
